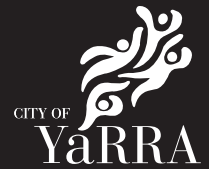

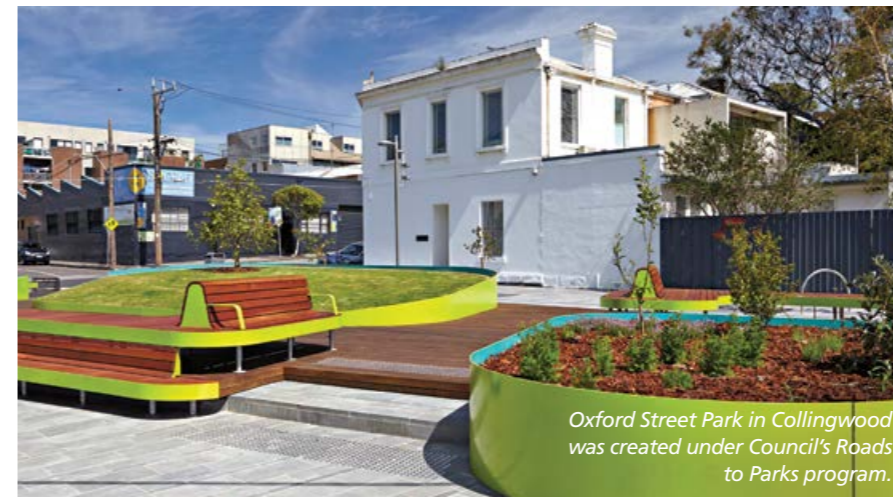

YARRA NAMED SUSTAINABLE CITY OF THE YEAR

Yarra was named 2016 Sustainable City of the Year at the recent Keep Victoria Beautiful Awards.

In addition to winning the major award, Yarra also won three out of eight category awards including the

Community Action and Leadership Award for Yarra's innovative Roads to Parks program. This initiative has seen five new neighbourhood parks created in place of roads and carparks since 2009.

Other Yarra wins include the Cultural Heritage Award for the restoration of the Collingwood Town Hall and the Active Schools Award won by Melbourne Girls College.

Yarra was shortlisted for 15 projects across eight categories in the annual awards, which encourage, motivate and celebrate sustainability achievements of metropolitan communities across Australia.

Organised by Keep Australia Beautiful Victoria, the prestigious award recognises Yarra's role in leading the local government sector in sustainability, demonstrating our ongoing commitment to the values and aspirations of the Yarra community.

Yarra will go on to represent Victoria in the national awards later this year.

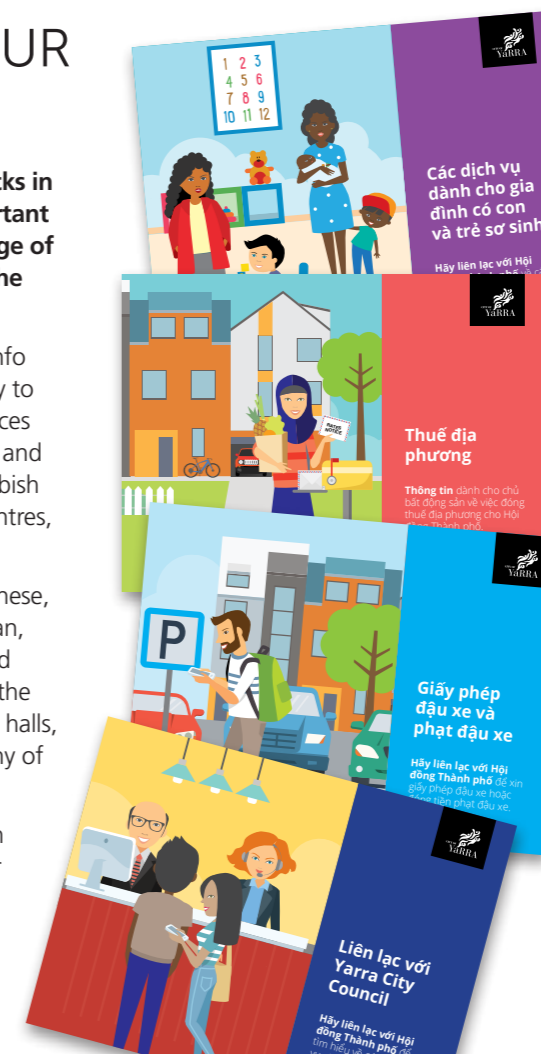
SPEAKING YOUR LANGUAGE

IN THE BUSINESS OF BEING GREEN

Richmond family-owned furniture business **Jordan** was a joint winner of the Business category in the 2016 Yarra Sustainability Awards.

The company is operated by brothers Nick and Mike Garnham, who embrace sustainability and believe that making small, meaningful changes everyday can create a big impact over time. We talk to them about their philosophy.

Q: You are committed to socially and ecologically responsible design and manufacturing; and minimising waste and by-products. Tell us about how you have worked with the Yarra Energy Foundation (YEF) to improve your environmental practices?

A: We have installed 74 high quality polycrystalline solar panels on the rooftop of our Richmond flagship store. These, along with other energy efficiency measures, have lowered the amount of grid-supplied energy we consume by 70%, reducing our carbon emissions by approximately 30 tonnes annually.

Q: Your business is widely recognised for its sustainability credentials and enjoys a position as an employer of choice for many working in the sector. Tell us about some of your leadership achievements.

A: Our range is certified to Choice Australia (GECA) Level A, ensuring we meet a high level of environmental standards, including low emissions of VOC and Formaldehydes. In 2014, we also officially became a Carbon Neutral organisation.

Q: What are three tips you would give to businesses wanting to improve their sustainability?

A:

- Look to source materials from suppliers who provide sustainable products. For example, changing your office paper to a product that is PEFC-rated, which promotes sustainable forest management.
- Introduce a company-wide recycling program for all waste items.
- Implement a Switch Off campaign for electrical appliances to reduce energy consumption.

BUDGET 2016/17

After considering more than 130 submissions from the community, Council has formally adopted a financially responsible and balanced budget for 2016/17.

The new budget will deliver services and infrastructure essential for community wellbeing, including improvements to local roads, services for families and children, support for local businesses and much more.

Budget highlights include:

- \$8 million to maintain and enhance Yarra's open space network.
- \$5 million to complete the North Fitzroy Library and Community Hub.
- \$2.5 million to improve the Collingwood, Fitzroy and Richmond recreation centres.
- \$2 million for community grants.
- \$220,000 to progress the Wellington Street separated bicycle lane from

Gipps Street to Johnston Street, Collingwood.

- \$40,000 for Yarra's public arts program.

This year Council has increased its overall rates by 2.5% (which is in line with the State Government cap) and increased the pensioner rebate from \$170 to \$175 per annum.

RATES NOTICES ON THE WAY

Property owners will receive their rates notice this month. Rates help provide the infrastructure, services and programs that make Yarra a great place to live.

While the State Government has capped overall rate increases at 2.5% for 2016/17, it is important to remember that almost all properties in Yarra (and elsewhere throughout Victoria) will experience rates changes that are higher or lower than 2.5%.

This is because:

1. The 2.5% cap does not apply to individual bills, but rather to the total amount of money that Council is seeking from rates revenue.

2. All Victorian properties were revalued this year and rates will change according to the new value of each property relative to other properties in Yarra.

A brochure containing more detail on this process and the many essential services that rates support will be sent to all ratepayers along with their rates notice.

MURAL BRINGS FORGOTTEN STORIES TO LIFE

Real-life stories of unrequited love and misfortune that played out on the streets of Collingwood at the turn of the century serve as the inspiration for a beautiful new local mural.

Shaping Change is a pop up public art project at Peel Street Park in Collingwood, created by artists Rebecca Power and William Wilding.

Drawing on the archives of the Victorian Police Museum, the work re-imagines the

intertwined and tragic stories of several migrant women in Melbourne, exploring themes such as the migrant experience, women's changing place in society and finding beauty in the face of hardship.

Experience another dimension to the mural using augmented reality technology on your smartphone. Simply download the free Layar app from iTunes or Google Play and scan the mural with your device to discover a video and stories about the historical figures that inspired the project.

The work has been made possible with the support of Council, Swinburne University and local art suppliers and will be on display until the end of August.

RICHMOND LIBRARY REVAMP REVEALED

A revamped Richmond Library is open to the public following recent refurbishments, with library users now enjoying a freshened space, increased computer access and a new modern look.

Extra communal spaces – along with 10 additional computers, new furniture, fresh carpet and moveable shelving – invite even more people to visit the library, the largest of the five Yarra Libraries branches.

The refurbishment allows for improved computer training classes, pop-up maker space activities, author talks, cultural

events and art exhibitions. Increased desk space for computer users, along with enhanced power point access, also allows many more users to comfortably work, study or relax in the space.

NORTH FITZROY HUB NEARS COMPLETION

The roof is on and most of the windows are in as the much-awaited North Fitzroy Library and Community Hub heads towards its early 2017 opening. It is on time and on budget.

The three-level hub is located on a triangular piece of land on St Georges Road in the heart of North Fitzroy. With its community rooftop garden and its ship-shape design, incorporating a strong bow and portholes, the hub is sure to become an iconic Yarra building. It has been designed to the Green Building Council of Australia 6-star World Excellence standard.

The outside of the building will incorporate recycled brickwork, polished and etched concrete panels and perforated brass cladding.

Inside will be a library, a maternal and child health centre, customer service area, seminar rooms, and community meeting and function rooms.

Council is also planning streetscape improvements to nearby Best Street including new trees, bike hoops and traffic calming measures.

ONE MILLION STORIES INSPIRES YARRA'S CHILDREN

William is only three years old but he shared 89 stories with his parents in the first month of the Yarra Libraries' One Million Stories program.

His mother, Collingwood resident Hanna, said that the program has inspired William to read even more stories than usual. "When we read to William, he really listens to every word," she said.

One Million Stories recognises the contribution that a whole community can make to the learning outcomes of children. The program, run jointly by Yarra Libraries and Alice Springs Public Library, is aimed at children from 0 to 8 years. Children are asked to count and

register the number of shared stories experienced with a parent, a friend, a relative or a teacher. It can be a story they have heard or read or even a rhyme or a song.

Tiago, 7, Eliza, 5, and Saskia, 2, of Abbotsford, are registered with One Million Stories. Mum Jo said her children love books.

"Eliza is just learning to read herself and now reads out signs to us wherever we go.

"Saskia just loves listening to stories and will often turn the pages of a book and 'read' it to herself, especially if she's already heard it many times before.

“ One million stories has made us aware of how many books we do read. Sometimes 20 or so a day! ”

In its first month, 112 families registered for One Million Stories and the story tally hit 19,826. Stories are also being counted through childcare centres, schools and library storytime sessions.

STREAMLINING HODDLE STREET PROJECT

The Victorian Government has provided \$60 million for VicRoads to deliver the first stage of Streamlining Hoddle Street Project.

The first stage will include upgrades to four key intersections along Hoddle Street: Swan Street, Brunton Avenue, Johnston Street and the Eastern Freeway.

Throughout July, VicRoads sought feedback on the preliminary concept designs from residents and traders

nearby to the intersections, as well as key community groups and other stakeholders.

VicRoads is working with Council and is seeking feedback from the wider community to help with refining and finalising the new intersection concepts.

TRANSITIONING TO THE NDIS

Council is assisting eligible people to transition to the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), which commenced on 1 July, giving people with a disability greater choice and control over who provides their services.

The NDIS is a significant reform in the disability sector. To be eligible, you must be aged under 65 on application, be living with permanent and significant disability, and be a permanent resident.

Yarra is one of the first municipalities in Victoria to roll out the NDIS, with about 750 local residents expected to join.

Eligible people currently receiving disability services from Council will continue to receive those services until they commence their NDIS plan. People not eligible for the NDIS will continue to receive Council services and will not be affected.

The Brotherhood of St Laurence is partnering with the National Disability Insurance Agency to deliver the NDIS in north east Melbourne.

Yarra is arguably Victoria's cycling capital with 57km of on-road bike lanes, 32km

shared off-road paths and 8.5% of residents riding to work. Chances are that there is already a strong cycling culture in your workplace and this is something to celebrate on National Ride2Work Day. But it's also a day to encourage new riders to have a go.

We know that around 30% of new riders are still riding at least once a week six months after National Ride2Work Day.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS COMING UP

Elections for the Yarra City Council will be held on Saturday 22 October.

Yarra City Council elections are held by attendance ballot, meaning you will have to attend a polling place on the day or, if you are eligible, make an application for a postal vote or lodge a pre-poll vote in advance of election day.

Voting is compulsory for most people on the electoral roll, although people aged 70 years or older are not required to vote.

In the lead up to the election, Council will operate in caretaker mode (starting from Wednesday 21 September to Saturday 22 October). This means that Council will not make any major planning decisions, enter into any large contracts or make significant employment decisions during this

period. It also means that our public statements and use of social media will be limited.

The caretaker period does not affect Council services in anyway and all of our facilities will be open as usual.

RICHMOND SECONDARY SCHOOL UPDATE

Council has long advocated for improved educational opportunities for young people in Richmond and welcomes the Victorian Government's \$43 million commitment to build a new secondary school in the area.

This funding will allow for continued planning and delivery of the school that will cater for 650 students and will open Term 1, 2018.

The Government has advised that the school will be built across two sites, with one building in Gleadell Street (next to Citizens Park) and another in

nearby Highett Street (at the corner of Griffiths Street).

The two sites will allow flexibility in the school's design, the ability to expand for future growth and increased outdoor and recreational space.

The main school administration buildings will be on Highett Street site and the gym and sports precinct will be on the Gleadell Street site.

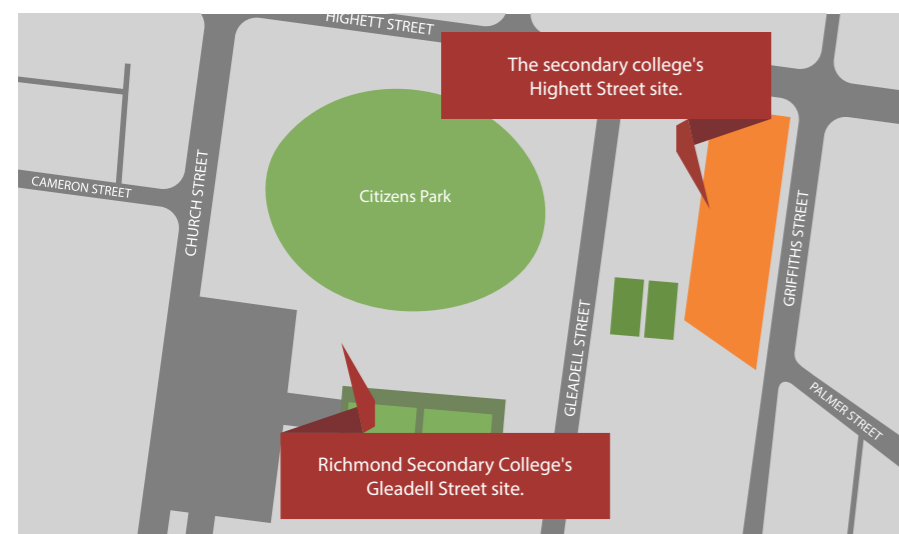

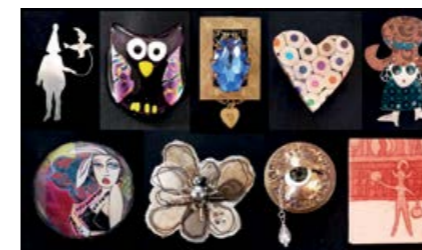
