Library Management gave a presentation of recent initiatives and achievements, asking for feedback from the Committee about how these actions were perceived within the community and what we could do differently if another lockdown situation should arise (Slides attached).

Agenda Item: Priorities for 2021

Committee workshopped three major projects for 2021 with committee members, asking for ideas and feedback to guide their development and implementation:

Open Library

- Planetary night events
- Kids Homework Hour 6pm-7pm. Encourage "group types" to attend and have tutors present
- Advertised widely, e.g. to people who don't usually use libraries but would value a safe space at night
- Open to Workforce (working from home) promote to small businesses
- Committee members were keen to participate in the testing phase
- Additional servicing and/or use of private meeting spaces e.g. counselling
- Youth-led and designed programs
- Access to study space is a big positive to opening the library at night
- Bunnings workshops skills and courses
- Digital Literacy workshops
- Financial Literacy & Management Classes
- Gaming Night
- Sunday Roast community dinners
- Questions RE risk mitigation and loss prevention. How would the space be cleaned ahead of the morning and would security footage be viewed?

Working For Victoria

- Tackle the digital divide, especially old-age pensioners
- Translated onto Telegram app
- A role for job linkages
- Bike riding lessons & electric bike loans
- Network nights to facilitate connections for when the WFV scheme ends
- Feeling of needing to keep to short-term goals for this project that the Library can sustain
- Teaching people how to read nutrition information on food packaging
- Baby stuff swaps
- Partnering with local organisations to facilitate training e.g. health and wellbeing
- Family management (life skills)
- Tutoring the promotion of Studiosity
- Mobile libraries (taking wi-fi and books to parks, allowing people to join the library)
- Create a social inclusion program centred around digital/physical resources and book clubs
- Opportunity for ongoing work

Volunteering

- Leads into jobs
- Seen as a positive step in community building
- Recommendation to ensure diversity of volunteers
- Face-to-face pairings; walks with the elderly
- Buddy program match skills and need
- Garden blitzes
- English language conversation opportunities
- Reading practice (one-to-one)
- Interest-based classes led by experienced volunteer
- Seen as a way for the community to "own" some of the good work libraries do
- Tutors gardening, tech skills
- Have a community liaison someone to regularly check-in with volunteers and clients




