Accessible tram stop upgrades to Victoria Street

Two pairs of easy-access tram stops will be installed in Victoria Street Richmond in February, following extensive community consultation by VicRoads and Yarra Trams.

Council has been working with Public Transport Victoria, VicRoads and Yarra Trams since last September on the construction of the accessible tram stops which will link up with the

growing number of accessible stops already in place throughout the municipality and wider Melbourne.

The tram stops are located at stop 19, North Richmond Train Station and stop 20, Nicholson/Lennox Street. Both will provide level entry and exit from trams to the kerbside and greatly benefit people with accessibility impairments, the elderly and people with prams.

Preliminary works are expected to start on Wednesday, 10 February, and the major work (including the closure of Victoria Street from Hoddle Street to Church Street) is planned to occur through the week of 21-28 February.

Challenges for Council in wake of rate cap

The State Government's announcement in December that Victorian Council rate rises will be capped at 2.5 per cent for 2016/17 will have a significant impact on Yarra Council.

This enforced cap will mean fewer available funds to allocate to capital works, services and major projects.

According to the Municipal Association of Victoria, Council rates have risen at a lower rate each year than State taxes which have risen an average 5.59 per cent each year for the past decade and State property taxes which have increased an average 7.13 per cent a year.

Council rates deliver hundreds of vital local services, and Council accepts that its limited resources will need to be used carefully. However, the rate cap will very significantly reduce Council's income.

As mandated by the State Government, Council will also be undertaking a property revaluation process in 2016.

Victorian Government legislation requires all properties in Yarra, and across Victoria, to be valued every two years on a common date, the last occurring in January 2014.

The amount of rates to be paid by an individual property will depend upon the movement in value of that property compared to the value of all other properties in the municipality. All properties in Yarra will be revalued as of 1 January 2016.

Australia Day winners

Abbotsford-based charity FareShare, who cook more than one million free nutritious meals a year for charities across the State, have been named as Yarra's 2016 Community Service of the Year.

Formally recognised in Council's 2016 Australia Day honours, FareShare rescues surplus food that businesses can no longer use, saving it from landfill and turning it into meals for thousands of Victorians who are in need.

What's more, this year more than 7,000 volunteers got cooking in the FareShare kitchen, including local secondary school students and local business workers.

"Being named the Community Service of the Year is fantastic recognition for our staff and 750 regular volunteers who cook 5,000 meals a day for the hungry, homeless and those doing it tough," said FareShare CEO, Marcus Godinho.

But despite cooking and delivering more than one million meals this year, demand is greater than ever with Marcus revealing FareShare currently receives two to three calls a week from charities requesting more food.

Sophie can often be found cooking, cleaning, and driving homeless people around to provide them company. In addition to her extensive community work, Sophie is also a mother-of-two and cares for a son with special needs.

Young Citizen of the Year – Rebecca Chapman

A volunteer with Eating Disorders Victoria, Rebecca Chapman has incredible passion and motivation for assisting people who are experiencing eating disorders and strives to improve their quality of life. The 25-year-old goes above and beyond in her work and has also been instrumental in setting up a project which provides eating disorder-related education and information to education professionals, school-aged children and their parents.

Yarra joins Bike Share network

No bike? No worries! Yarra has joined the Melbourne Bike Share phenomenon, with sites now in operation in the municipality.

The sites – located at Yorkshire Brewery in Wellington Street, Collingwood, the Australian Catholic University on the corner of Napier Street and Victoria Parade – link into the network which currently extends through the cities of Melbourne and Port Phillip.

In the coming months, Yarra will also be adding a third station on the corner of Moor and Young streets in Fitzroy (adjacent to the Fitzroy Library), providing great access to Brunswick Street.

Yarra's involvement in the innovative program is part of Council's 2013-2017 Plan and continues Council's commitment to providing sustainable transport options.

An ideal way to travel around Yarra and beyond, Bike Share is designed for short

trips across the city. To use, simply purchase a subscription or pass that suits you, take a bike when you need it and then return it to one of the 50 bike stations throughout the network. Helmets are also provided with each bike.

Leading the way on sustainable building design

Sustainable design elements must now be incorporated into new residential and commercial developments in Yarra and across inner Melbourne.

This follows the introduction late last year of ground-breaking planning rules developed by Yarra Council in partnership with Moreland, Whitehorse, Stonnington, Port Phillip and Banyule councils.

The rules are embodied in the Environmentally Sustainable Development Policy, under which new buildings must be designed to be energy efficient, have good access to daylight and use natural ventilation for cooling.

Where possible, developments will need to incorporate renewable energy features such as solar power, rainwater tanks, and space for recycling and green waste. Larger developments may also need to provide a green travel plan, which could include car sharing or electric car charging facilities.

These and other environmentally-friendly design elements will need to be considered by developers early in the planning permit application process, ensuring that opportunities for sustainable features are maximised and costs are kept down.

Yarra Council has long been a leader in sustainable building design, offering the popular voluntary Sustainable Design Assessment in the Planning Process (SDAPP) program. The principles of the new policy will be embedded into Yarra's planning scheme, making sure new houses, apartments and commercial buildings will be better for the environment and cheaper to run.
