MEET YOUR NEW COUNCIL



Yarra's new elected Councillors for 2020–24 were sworn in, and the 2020–21 Mayor was elected, during a ceremony Monday 16 November.

Langridge ward

Cr Gabrielle de Vietri (Mayor):

Cr de Vietri has lived in Yarra for 15 years and works in the arts, as well as being a community activist and a paralegal. She loves our vibrant and diverse neighbourhoods, our creeks, rivers and parklands. This is Cr de Vietri's first year as a Councillor.

Cr Stephen Jolly: Cr Jolly is an experienced Yarra Councillor of 16 years. He is particularly interested in advocating for public housing residents, those on lower incomes and local businesses, and against unsustainable development.

Cr Anab Mohamud: Cr Mohamud came to Australia as a Somalian refugee 20 years ago and has lived in Fitzroy's public housing estate since 2006. She loves living in the heart of diverse and culturally rich Fitzroy. This is her first year as a Councillor.

Melba ward

Cr Claudia Nguyen (Deputy Mayor):

Born in Yarra, Cr Nguyen is a massive AFL fan who loves a kick at Citizens Park. She is Secretary of the Melbourne University Women's Football Club, holds a senior policy role in the public service, and is the daughter of Vietnamese refugees who called the Richmond public housing home. This is Cr Nguyen's first term as Councillor.

Cr Edward Crossland: Cr Crossland is a town planning, transport and urban design professional. He has more than a decade of experience working in local and state government. This is his first term as Councillor.

Cr Herschel Landes: An experienced local business operator of more than 30 years, Cr Landes was formerly Bridge Road Traders Association President. Cr Landes is committed to reinvigorating some of Yarra's iconic shopping precincts. This is his first term as a Councillor.

Nicholls ward

Cr Bridgid O'Brien: A lifelong Yarra resident, Cr O'Brien became a Councillor in 2019. She is passionate about protecting our wildlife and the biodiversity of Yarra. She is also a strong advocate for community participation in the decision-making process.

Cr Amanda Stone: Cr Stone is a long-term Yarra resident, Councillor of 12 years, and former Mayor of Yarra City Council. She chairs the Headspace Collingwood consortium, and is Executive Chair of ICLEI Oceania, a global body promoting sustainability in local government.

Cr Sophie Wade: Cr Wade is a lawyer and community-minded Yarra resident. She loves that we live in an incredibly diverse area, with people who come from all walks of life. This is Cr Wade's first term as Councillor.

The Community Vision will also shape our next four-year Council Plan, and 10-year plans for how we manage the city's finances and assets.

In this first stage we're asking everyone in Yarra to share their thoughts and priorities with us.

We'll be doing this through online engagement and workshops, pop-up events, conversations and direct outreach.

Community panel

In the next stage, we'll bring together an independently selected community panel that will create our brand new Community Vision.



The community panel will meet over several weeks in mid-2021 to review the findings from the first stage of engagement and draft the vision.

At the end of this all, it will be formally presented to your councillors for adoption.

The *Local Government Act 2020* creates this opportunity to partner with our community to build a shared vision we can all be proud of.

YARRA AWARDED CLIMATE CHAMPION

Yarra City Council is immensely proud to be the recipient of the Climate Champion Award in the Cities Power Partnership Climate Awards 2020.

Yarra has a long history of taking bold climate action, as one of the first local governments to declare a climate emergency in 2017.

Yarra Council is powered by 100% renewable electricity from solar panels across 38 Council sites, and wind power from by the Melbourne Renewable Energy Project.

Yarra is also just the second council in Australia to create a Climate Emergency Plan, which acknowledges the role everyone has in responding to the climate emergency.

As part of our climate emergency response, we're transitioning all our buildings to be all-electric and gas-free by 2030, and helping our community go renewable, aiming to double rooftop solar by 2030.

WELCOME BACK, YARRA!

Our city is waking up again! It's never been a more exciting time to acquaint yourself with the cafes, restaurants, bars and shops you've missed these last few months.

Our iconic cafes, restaurants and shopping precincts are what makes Yarra special. They're a vital part of the local community and economy.

You may notice special concrete bollards with coloured material covers appearing in the streets and suburbs near you. We have set these up to help keep you safe while dining outside this summer.

Business grants to welcome people back to our streets

Yarra is awarding \$320,000 in grants for businesses and community groups in Yarra to deliver projects that activate, promote and enhance our vibrant and much-loved precincts.

These initiatives will help attract more visitors to these precincts, encouraging people to shop, eat, and have fun in their local area again after months of restrictions.

As the lifeblood of Yarra's economy, our businesses, sole traders and retail precincts are essential to the city's recovery from COVID-19.

There'll be a second round of grant funding announced in January 2021.

Helping businesses open their doors

Yarra Council has set up a rapid response team to assess applications for extended outdoor dining permits during the recovery period.

We've created free, flexible and fast-tracked outdoor dining permits so that businesses in Yarra can welcome back customers as soon as it's safe to do so.

Since going live with our outdoor dining permits in early October we have received an impressive 248 applications from businesses looking to extend their outdoor dining space!

And fees for footpath trading permits, food registrations, health registrations and business parking permits won't be charged until at least 31 March 2021. This will ultimately save businesses around \$1.4 million in fees.

DOCUMENTING A RESILIENT COMMUNITY

Isolation Portraits is a stunning series of photographs and stories documenting people staying home during Melbourne's COVID-19 lockdowns, by local photographer Bri Hammond.

This special series of Isolation Portraits features some members of the wonderful and resilient community who call Collingwood and North Richmond public housing estates home.

The residents shared their experiences of lockdown and a little about their backgrounds, and the results are truly uplifting...

"I think that it's important to share the stories from the incredible individuals that live in public housing, to erase the stereotypes and stigmas that exist and lead to this unfair treatment," says Bri.

Over the course of a week Bri worked with Belgium Avenue Neighbourhood House and took pictures of residents through windows, down hallways and through doorways to ensure social distancing was maintained. The residents shared their experiences of lockdown and a little about their backgrounds, and the results are truly uplifting and depict the resilience of the community beautifully.



"I guess people think the homeless need a bed or an actual room, but in my experience people just need a safe place to rest their head, that's why I've taken in about 80 people to stay here in the 2 years that I have been living here.

Coronavirus has taught us that placing so much value outside the body in material things isn't good. When people are chasing all their own wants and their needs, they then forget to aid the needs of others, needs such as medical, home, food." – Bella

TURNING 110 IN LOCKDOWN

It's not every year that one of our residents turns 110, let alone while living through a global pandemic. Top that off with a state-wide lockdown and you'd likely think celebrations marking this momentous occasion would be underwhelming, but that's not the attitude of North Richmond's super-centenarian Van Hoa Lam.

Hoa usually spends her birthday with friends and staff at North Richmond Community Health Centre. This year, due to COVID-19 restrictions, she spent it at home, receiving phone calls and cards and focussing her attention on the memories of past celebrations and keeping herself active and fit.

It's partly down to this positive outlook that Hoa, who still lives independently at home, attributes her long life to.

"In my opinion, the main secret to a long life is to move your body, exercise moderately and maintain a good mood."

Born in Vietnam, Hoa moved to Australia in 1986 and has been living in North Richmond ever since. As a long standing Yarra resident, she has seen her neighbourhood go through many evolutions since she first arrived.

"It's more convenient nowadays, there are more parks than before so it is easy for the local people to do exercise safely and there are more entertainment centres for the elderly," Hoa says.

An inspiration to us all, we hope by next birthday Hoa is able to once again spend it celebrating with her friends and family.

"I came to Australia as a refugee from Vietnam ... The lockdown period has reminded me of the hardships I faced when I first came to Australia. My daughters have advised me to stay at home and not go out. I've felt a bit lonely because I can't go to the neighbourhood house to join the music activities but I try to keep healthy and think positively." – Nga



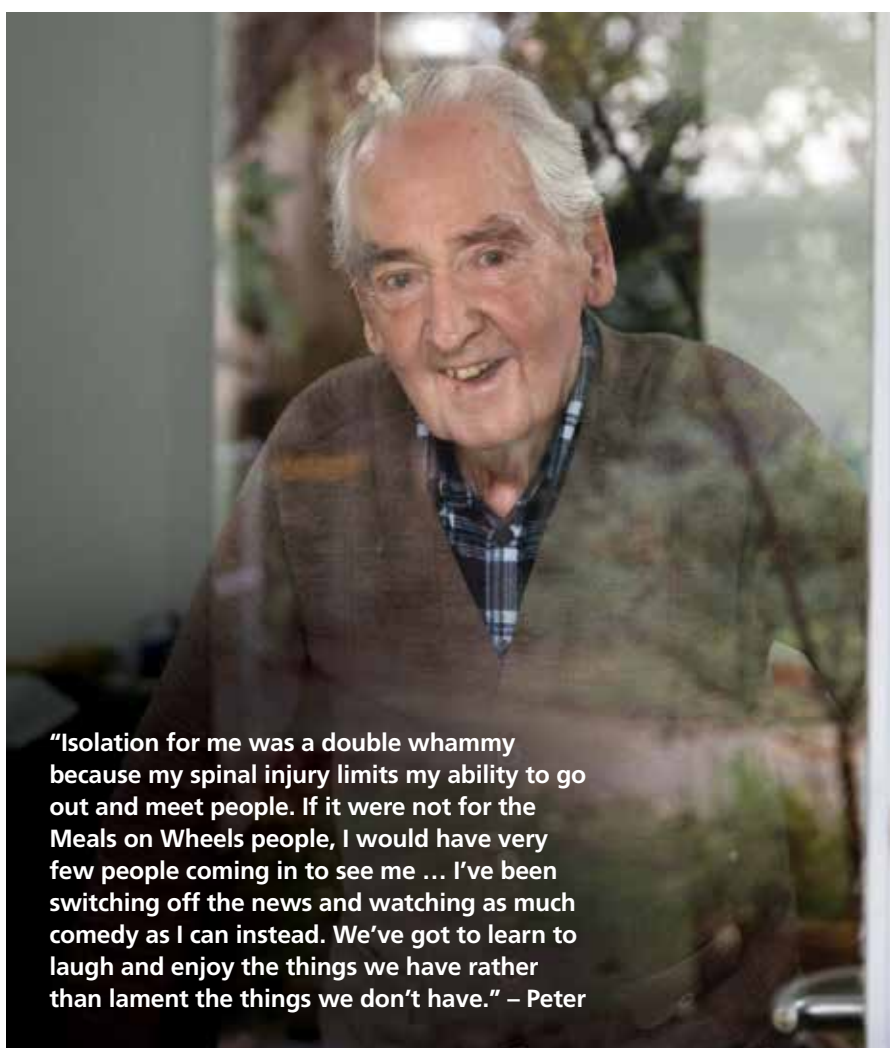

STARTED A GARDEN AND WANT TO KEEP IT GROWING?

Growing your own food is a great way to get outside the house and reconnect with nature. It's also the most local way there is to source food!

Residents from the Clifton Hill laneway garden shared some of their tips for summer gardening:

- Work together with friends or neighbours, so there will always be a helping hand to keep up the watering if you go away.
- Use shade cloth to protect your plants on scorching hot days.
- Try out some creative solutions to keep soil moist in hot weather, such as slow release watering.
- Use a thick layer of mulch to retain moisture for longer.
- The social aspect of the garden is really important. Sharing gardening knowledge and supporting each other is a great gift gardening can offer us.

GROW YOUR OWN WAY THIS SUMMER

Across Yarra, gardening and growing food has been embraced during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

The Clifton Hill laneway garden has been keeping locals busy and well fed for 12 years, but since COVID-19 first hit in March and locals suddenly found themselves needing to stay local, it's thrived more than ever.

"It has been wonderful to potter around in the quiet of the garden, escaping the confines of the house, the nagging computer and the endless Zoom meetings," says Clifton Hill laneway gardener Crina Virgona.

The garden uses a small laneway space that was once full of rubbish and weeds. Around 15 local residents all tend their own plants in the space while also helping each other.

Working together in local neighbourhoods to grow food and compost is a great way to improve not only our health but also the health of the planet.

And many locals seem to agree! Applications for our Community Growing Spaces program, which helps Yarra residents start their own garden in a public space, have doubled since March.

We now have 180 planter boxes, 6 laneway gardens, 5 community gardens and 11 schools gardens across Yarra.

Only plastic bottles labelled 1 and 2 (lids off), and plastic food packaging labelled 5, can go in your yellow-lidded recycling bin.



Collection

We are still doing weekly recycling collections, alternating between glass and other recyclables.
