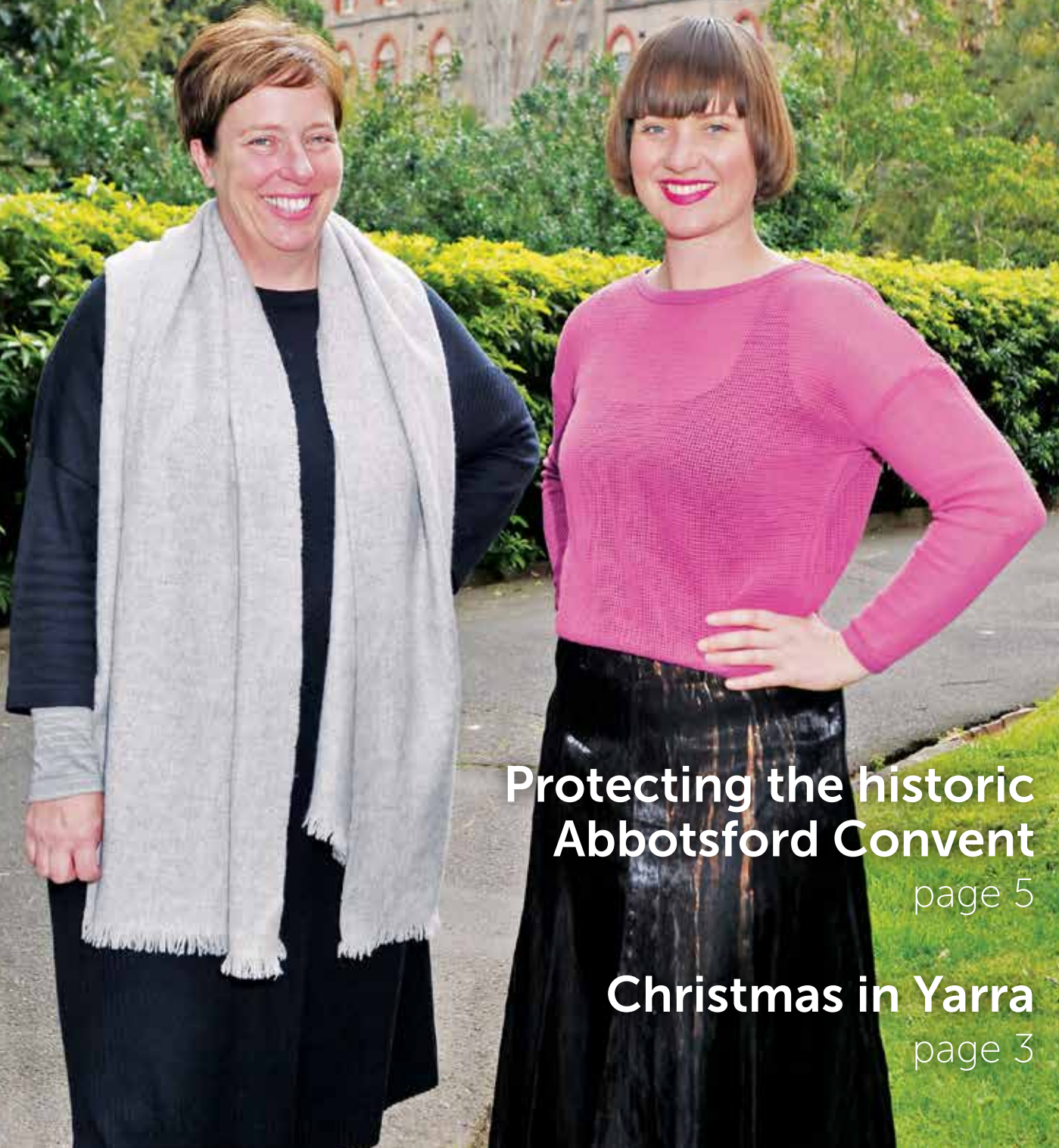
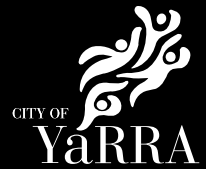

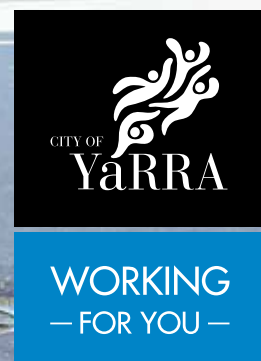

CLEANING UP WITH COUNCIL

Our City Works branch delivers a wide range of services to ensure that Yarra's roads, laneways and shopping strips are kept spick and span.

Council staff and contractors tackle rubbish and recycling, hard rubbish and green waste, as well as litter and graffiti. Importantly, we street sweep the entire city each month.

Our crews work every day of the year, including public holidays, and special arrangements are made for major events such as street festivals or the AFL Grand Final.

Cleansing Foreman Peter Baker meets with staff and contractors at our Clifton Hill depot to discuss the day's activities.

"Technology is playing a growing role in tracking how to improve our performance and meet targets," Peter says.

"We can monitor what streets need more attention and identify recurring hotspots."

Peter believes that quality cleaning involves constantly reviewing how his crew can deliver services in the most effective manner possible. "Every street is different and needs a particular approach to how it is cleaned. Whilst Swan Street has residents lining for

post-gym coffees by 7am, Brunswick Street is later to rise," Peter laughs.

Street cleaning ensures that our public spaces feel safe and comfortable, and that businesses are able to operate without any obstructions.

TRAINEE TIME

We have partnered with the Brotherhood of St Laurence to provide traineeships in street cleaning to residents experiencing disadvantage. The program has been successful in creating employment pathways for trainees, with some students having received full-time employment at the conclusion of their course.

CONVENT MAKES THE CUT

The Abbotsford Convent has become just the 111th site to be added to the Australian National Heritage List.

Visitors flock to Abbotsford Convent to see its heritage buildings, take in its arts exhibitions, relax in its sprawling gardens and enjoy a bite at its eateries. Attracting almost a million visitors a year, it is among the City of Yarra's most beloved destinations, and an important cog in the local economy.

Abbotsford Convent CEO Collette Brennan welcomed the decision. "Being placed alongside icons including the Sydney Opera House and Melbourne Cricket Ground puts the Convent on the map for students, historians and visitors alike, and is something we can all be proud of."

This listing is a major milestone in the effort to retain the historic elements of the convent. "Now that the Convent is included on the National Heritage List, the National Heritage values of the

Convent are protected under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999," she said.

The Sisters of the Good Shepherd established the Abbotsford Convent in 1863 and operated it for more than a century. The new heritage listing helps to acknowledge all aspects of the site's history, including the hardships that some women and girls suffered during their time at the convent.

Community members campaigned to save the site during the 1990s and the not-for-profit Abbotsford Convent Foundation took over in 2004. Since then the heritage aspects of the Convent have been preserved even as the site has evolved into a celebrated centre of arts and culture.

Yarra Council continues to support a range of creative practitioners at the site through its annual grants program.

LEADING THE WAY ON WASTE AND RECYCLING

We're joining our community in tackling inner city waste and recycling challenges and providing residents with a more sustainable approach to reducing waste.

Together we are moving beyond traditional approaches to managing waste, to embrace face-to-face education and innovative local solutions to minimise waste production.

Community support for this approach has been unprecedented. We have seen major improvements at every stage of the waste management cycle, from making more sustainable purchasing decisions to reusing resources, avoiding the creation of waste all together and recycling correctly.

Last year:

- total waste generated for kerbside collection decreased by 98 tonnes.
- about 97% of goods left at recycling drop-off points were recycled and reused.
- more than 540 tonnes of hard waste was recycled.
- almost 10,000 tonnes of material was recycled.

We consider engaging with our community in a personalised way and providing skills and tools to be critical to our success. By knocking on doors and completing bin-checks, we are able to have important conversations with our residents. Where this isn't possible, we are providing information and resources.

Tackling these problems today will also help us keep a lid on the proportion of rates income that needs to be spent on waste management and recycling in the future.

We're harnessing the energy and enthusiasm of our community, and working closely with waste and recycling authorities such as the Metropolitan Waste Management Group, Environment Protection Authority, Sustainability Victoria, Visy Recycling and Four Seasons.

We are empowering our community with the knowledge and skills to be accountable for their impact on the waste management cycle. We're doing this through regular education and consultation around waste minimisation.

Humanity is currently consuming resources at a much faster rate than we are replenishing them. That's why we need to continue working together to reduce our waste-related impacts on the environment.



RECYCLE US

Emily, David, Marlo, Kara, Arkie and Olga achieved the best results in the first round of our Recycle Us program, significantly reducing their recycling contamination and resource loss. This involves checking residents' recycling and rubbish bins and offering constructive advice. The number of households recycling correctly improved by 30% during the first round, so we're now planning to expand the program to more properties.



FOOD KNOW HOW

Our award-winning Food Know How initiative provides community members with tips on smart food planning, shopping, cooking, storage, and growing food at home to help reduce waste and save time and money. Joining Food Know How is a great first step to help Yarra reduce food waste. Visit foodknowhow.yarracity.vic.gov.au to take a five-week challenge and get started today.



CLEANER MUDDS

Our Multi-Unit Development (MUD) program recognises that some residents living in apartments struggle with recycling.

We're supporting participating building managers with project plans, waste audits and colour coded bin lids, as well as with educational material.

So far this program has seen bin contamination reduced by 20% and resource loss reduced by 10%.

"Resource loss" occurs when recyclable materials are incorrectly placed in standard rubbish bins.

"Bin contamination" occurs when non-recyclable materials are incorrectly placed in recycling bins.

LESS LITTER

With support from Sustainability Victoria, we're working to lighten the litter load.

Our promotional campaign has seen a reduction in public litter, especially plastic bags, coffee cups, straws, water bottles, and wet wipes.

Melbourne Farmers Market is using a Council grant to eliminate single-use coffee cups at their Saturday Market at Collingwood Children's Farm.

RECYCLING SCHOOL

We're working with local schools to show young people that recycling can be fun and rewarding. One activity has students create artwork out of old rubbish. We find that education leads to better habits.

Recycling contamination has been reduced by 15% in our initial rollout of the program, and these results have encouraged us to expand to other local schools.

A CLEAN SLATE

We're giving away free graffiti removal kits and paint vouchers to help you join the fight against graffiti.

We'll be teaming with Victoria Police at four locations during November and December to offer advice and hand out tools for removing graffiti from your property.

The best way to deter graffiti is to remove it as quickly as possible. At Council, we work year-round to ensure

it is removed from public places like parks and playgrounds soon after it occurs.

We want to support you to do the same when you notice graffiti on your own property, so we can all do our bit to keep Yarra's streets clean and graffiti free.

JANUARY 26: A TIME FOR REFLECTION

We're proud to be Australian, and we believe that our celebration of national identity should be held on a date that is inclusive of everyone in our community.

January 26 commemorates the arrival of the First Fleet. For our local and broader Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community, this means the beginning of invasion, dispossession and tragic loss of life, land, culture and language.

Council's decision not to recognise January 26 as a day of celebration does not impact on the way our residents spend the day. People are still welcome to enjoy the public holiday in local parks or in any other way they choose.

But in the lead up to January 26, 2018 and on the day itself, we do encourage people to take a moment to reflect on what this date represents to the

Aboriginal community.

If you would like to acknowledge and celebrate Aboriginal culture on January 26, you may be interested in attending the Share the Spirit Festival, which takes place at Treasury Gardens in Melbourne's CBD. This free annual event celebrates Aboriginal music and culture, and features performances from renowned Aboriginal artists.

Council will hold a small Smoking Ceremony for the local Aboriginal community on January 26, to acknowledge their experiences and also to celebrate their culture which still flourishes.

New recreational facilities at Yarra Primary School are available for community use.

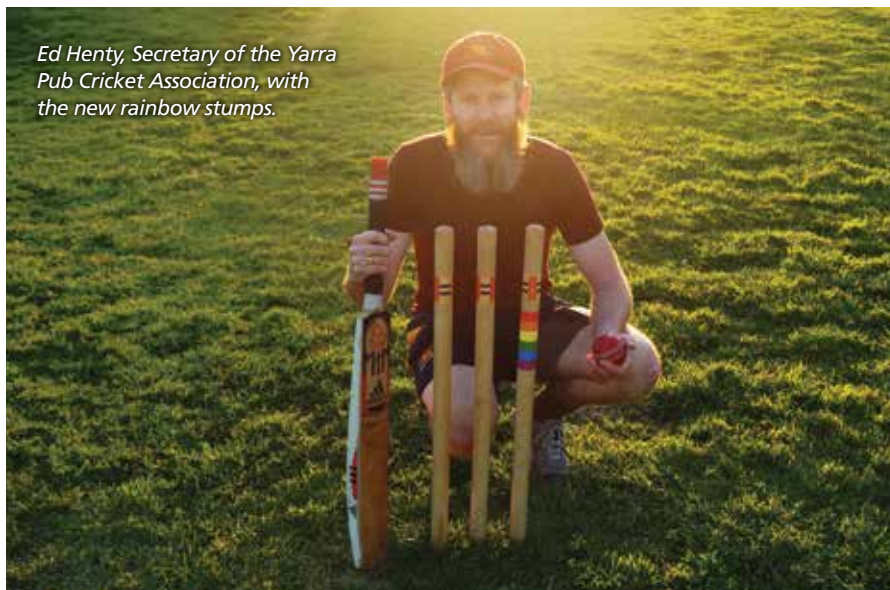
